There are many different ways to measure the square footage of a condominium unit, such as measurements from the outside, inside or mid-point of perimeter walls. Statements of approximate dimensions, floor areas, ceiling heights or volumes (collectively, the "Area") of a Unit may be made in marketing materials, construction drawings, or other items. Those statements of Area are based on measurements that in some instances are measured to the mid-point or outside of the perimeter walls of the condominium unit, as opposed to the actual legal boundary of the condominium unit, as defined in the condominium documents. This may result in the Area of the condominium unit as stated in condominium documents being lower than the Area of the condominium unit as stated above or in any construction drawings, marketing materials or other items.
